Welcome to ASPAN 2016. We are once again running this unique meeting that is specifically designed to provide multidisciplinary, clinically-focused updates on pancreatic diseases. The meeting is again to be held in Newcastle although with a change in venue to the Hunter Medical Research Institute on the campus of John Hunter Hospital.

The agenda will again cover the multidisciplinary diagnosis and management of pancreatic adenocarcinoma, neuroendocrine tumours, IPMN, acute and chronic pancreatitis including autoimmune IgG4 disease with a focus on genetic mechanisms of disease and recent guideline updates. There will be contributions from gastroenterologists, surgeons, radiologists, oncologists with the addition of a specific dietician-led course designed for nutritionists.

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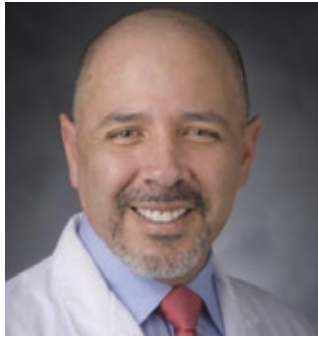
## International Faculty
